Activity 2: Change the tense of a story.

1. Find the first verb in the story. Use the mouse to highlight the verb. Change it to **bold**.

For example:

Blanca **lives** in Shelton. She **studies** all the time. She **takes** English classes all the time.

What **is** Efrain doing? Maybe he **is** working. He **lives** in Shelton, too. When he **has** time he **comes** to English class.

2. Make the rest of the verbs in the story **bold**.

3. Change the tense of the story. This story is in the present tense and can be changed to past tense. Highlight each bold word and type the new word in its place.

The new story looks like this:

Blanca lived in Shelton. She studied all the time. She took English classes all the time.

What was Efrain doing? Maybe he was working. He lived in Shelton, too. When he had time he came to English class.
